


Dedicated to Our Mothers and Fathers





SCIENTIA

Scientia was organized to foster an interest in the study of Natural Science among students, to bring it on as high a cultural p'ane as other branches of learning, to encourage a greater interest in spiritual matters, and to promote improvement of equipment and facilities in the Science department.

The membership of Scientia is composed of all students interested in science—premedical students, home economic students, and science majors. Others are eligible for special membership. Professor Hoen, head of the Science Department is the faculty adviser. At its regular meetings demonstrations and lectures along lines of scientific interest are given by both student and guest participants. Films are shown frequently and an annual "Open House" welcomes the entire campus population to help celebrate the spirit of "Scientia". Other entertainments not confined to classrooms are also sponsored by the club.

LANGUAGE CLUBS

The foreign language clubs, composed of advanced students, and sponsored by the teachers of those departments, have been formed for the purpose of broadening our minds and adding to our interest in other people, customs, and languages.

Le Cercle Français, under the direction of Mrs. Ella Iden-Edwards, has given numerous informal programs in an effort to encourage its members in an understanding and love of the language and French people.

El Circulo Castellano, under Miss Granbois' supervision affords many opportunities for the mastery of Spanish. Those who have gone forth to work in Spanish countries can testify to the value of the social hours spent in the clubs where English is forgotten and the understanding of Spanish is a necessity.

This year the *Deutcher Sprachverein* was organized for the benefit of the ever growing number of German linguists. Mutual interest on the part of the members, in a practical way, has led to the success of the club in presenting programs for the purpose of acquainting the students with German people and their customs.

THE TUPOTHETAE CLUB

The Typothetae Club was established at Emmanuel Missionary College to provide an organization in which printers may meet in a social way, and at the same time broaden their knowledge of the unlimited field of printing. The monthly meetings prove inspirational and instructive. The club membership includes al! who work in the College Press, and those who are in the printing classes.

This is the liveliest organization on the campus, and it is quite effective for instilling school spirit into our students. It is one of the most appreciated assets in our school campaigns. Some of the best marches, novelty selections, and few standard overtures help to make up its repertoire. The forty-four members are loyal, even to the point of early or late rehearsals.

CHORUS

We do not hear much said about the chorus, but an observer would know that something goes on in the chapel on Saturday evenings before programs, etc., should he see the people from the surrounding community as they gather for the weekly rehearsal. When we are permitted to listen in while the seventy voices render such selections as "The Heavens Are Telling", and "Gloria in Excellis", we realize that much time and effort have been spent in preparation, and we are charmed and inspired by the grandeur of the magnificent strains.
