The Bible enjoins courtesy, and it presents many illustrations of the unselfish spirit, the gentle grace, the winsome temper, that characterize true politeness.


#### BOOK IV - MANUAL TRAINING

There is a feeling of security in the knowledge that along with mental training one has acquired a working acquaintance of some manual art by which, if need be, he could earn a livelihood.














## **COLLEGE ORCHESTRA**





## CLOTHING LABORATORY

Two hundred g a r m e nt s have been constructed in the clothing laboratory this year. A great percentage of these were expertly tailored suits, professionally padded and lined. With guidance the girls find expression in design, color, and draping, and strive for efficiency and perfection in every detail.

## THE COOKING LABORATORY

Five classes each week take turns in the practical application of some phase of the culinary art. Students here receive practice in the basic principles of cookery, scientific meal planning, and more intensive nutritional problems.



## PROSPECTIVE TEACHERS

The crowning experience for the prospective teachers comes at the time when he begins actual teaching. At E. M. C. he has opportunity to enter gradually upon classroom duties under the general supervision of the director of student teaching. By following this plan the student teacher leaves his College not only with training in subject matter and theories of teaching, but with some experience.

## INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS CLUB

World problems are freely discussed in club meetings, giving each one present a better understanding of their meaning. Any member may participate in the open forum discussions by expressing his own individual views and ideas on the particular topic before the club. In this way the club objective, which is to create interest in current problems, is reached.

## **SCIENTIA**

The young scientists of this E. M. C. club are enabled to learn the most recent advances in science. Interesting programs of the year have included a discussion of photography and one on the life of ants. On a program presented in the auditorium were interesting features such as mathematical puzzles, and two-way amateur's radio broadcasting.









## SECRETARIAL SCIENCE

Interest is maintained in both shorthand and typewriting classes by a series of awards at various speed and accuracy levels. More than one hundred twenty such awards have been presented to students participating in the tests this year.

## CHEMISTRY LABORATORIES

In the busy college chemistry laboratories classroom theory is made to stand the test of open-minded experimentation. Practical experience is gained in the use of the most modern pieces of apparatus, the supply and variety of which is constantly being enlarged. In the last year much new and helpfulequipment in the field of physical chemistry especially, has been secured.

## **HEALTH SERVICE**



## MEDICAL CADETS


The Medical Cadet Corps at E. M. C. is only part of a large national organization. In the four states of the Lake Union Conference 1100 men have been trained this year. Officially designated as Corps No. 2 of the Lake Union Medical Cadet Corps, there are 125 men who will finish the first year's training. Arrayed in their gray-green uniforms and neat over-seas caps, they bring a grim reminder of the present world situation to the Campus. The course of study includes basic military training, principles of first aid to the wounded, and denominational principles of noncombatancy and Sabbath observance. The United States Army recognizes the worth of the training by making provision for graduates of this course to be inducted into the Medical Department of the Army when and if they are drafted into the service.









## THE MISSIONARY VOLUNTEER SOCIETY

"Victory in Christ" has been the theme of the Missionary Volunteer Society this year. In the overwhelming rush of college life, it is easy to fail in spiritual growth and development. It has been the purpose of the society meetings to supply the inspiration and spiritual stimulus needed to successfully combat the tendency to ease up in one's personal vigilance while in school.

The Missionary Band leaders have endeavored to enlist in their missionary program everyone within the circle of the society's influence. As a fitting culmination of the M. V. activities, we anticipate that a large group of master comrades will be ready for the Investiture Service near the close of the school year.

## THE MINISTERIAL ASSOCIATION

Meeting once in three weeks, it is led by a committee of four. Its purpose is to unite the Theological students in greater spiritual development, that they may play a quiet, but more effective, part in promoting the happiness of the school as a whole. The members consist primarily of Junior and Senior Religion Majors.

## STUDENT PASTORS


## THE MINISTERIAL SEMINAR


