What does a typical day look like for you? I wake up early either to practice or to go to classes. Around classes and homework, I usually use the practice rooms in Hamel Hall. I also participate in campus activities like the Creative Writing Club, working out at the AWC, reading, spending time with friends, or helping the PMC media team.

What's the best part of being in the music department? I think the best part is having space for creativity, even when playing compositions by other people because, eventually you have to create your style, your musical sign, that is recognizable by others. I love that there's always something exciting happening between the students like improvised jam sessions in the lobby or making an apple into a 3D meme! What drew you to music? I was frequently around music and played piano since I was young. I found in piano a way to express feelings that are hard to describe with words.

What is unique about what you learn compared to students in most other fields? Music is unique because there are fewer limits than verbal communication. The way a musician expresses both their feelings and the composer's purpose requires a unique use of all five senses and a lot of reflecting and listening. Sharing all those elements is a unique experience that cannot be fully explained or replicated in another way.

What advice would you give someone who was thinking about pursuing your major? I would suggest private lessons and participate in ensembles. If you feel comfortable and like those experiences, you will probably enjoy the Department of Music and pursuing a Music Major.

What have you learned from being a music major? Both creativity and efficiency. I practice 20 hours at least every week outside of class. Playing an instrument requires mindset and a lot of analysis. A good sensibility of sounds helps you create the sound you want and a lot of patience to fix any errors. The piano is not the only tool I need for music; I also have to take care of myself.

Have you had any exciting opportunities related to your major? Yes! That's how I decided to pursue a Performance Major! I traveled to Spain for a three-week intensive summer program, similar to a conservatory. I won second place in the national piano competition of my country, Bolivia. I also had the opportunity to study with two German pianists. I loved all of those experiences and I met a lot of excellent musicians as well!


What do you want to do with your major?





#### What does a typical day look like for you?

A typical day as a Junior in the Animal Science program starts early with 6 a.m. milking. Milking is done twice a day and I am responsible for two days with another Animal Science student. Then, depending on if I have time, I'll go to the caf or eat something in my room. Every morning I have an organic chemistry lecture with other juniors in the department. Most of my classes are science-based, except for the Honors program. Once I am done with lectures, I spend most of my time studying and reviewing for the upcoming tests.

### What's the best part of being in the Animal Science department?

The best part of being an Animal Science student is the hands-on experience that my department provides. Every semester I take care of different animals, and this has been the best experience during my time in Andrews. So far, I've raised poultry and calfs and participated in the kids and ewes birthing season. I always look forward to going down to the farm, as it takes my mind off the school work and helps me reconnect with the amazing creatures that God created.



#### What has working with the animals taught you?

Working with animals is a very personal experience and somewhat of a character-shaping experience. The most obvious thing would be the responsibility for the animals. There is no excuse not to get up in the morning and go down because no one will take care of the animals if it's not me. From time to time, animals get in trouble or do something frustrating. Therefore I have learned how to be patient along the way. We have a group of young goats on the farm that would somehow sneak into the cubeshaped feeders with metals bars, and then they had no idea how to get out when it was time for dinner. Every time they got stuck, Loren, Elena, and I had to climb in and lift a 50-70 lb animal without hurting anyone. This story may not seem like an inconvenience, but it gets hard when the weather is below zero. The most important thing that I learned and experienced from animals is the unconditional love and affection they give back at the end of my tough days. The cuddles and loving responses back from the animals do lift my spirit when I feel overwhelmed with school work.

#### What advice would you give your freshman self?

The first advice I would give to my freshmen self would be to spend more time with the animals! As a freshman, I was pretty busy with school work, especially with Foundations of Biology, but at the end of the day, animals are my future career, and I wish that I spent more time getting to know them from the beginning.

### What's the best part of being in the Aviation department?

I really enjoy spending time with people who share the same passion for aviation that I have. I am from Canada. Besides flying I enjoy working on cars and spending time with family and friends. I'm also a sports fan who always supports the home team even if they're 0-10.





## What are your plans after graduation?


I plan to start working in an architecture office full time after graduation. I'll also continue to pursue acquiring my license in architecture.

#### What's the best part of Proximity Vespers?



The ninety-sixth volume of the Cardinal was sent to Lithotech Graphic Services to be printed on March 7, 2022, located in Harrigan Hall, 8450 E Campus Circle Drive in Berrien Springs, Michigan, and had a press run of 375. The layout was completed using Adobe InDesign CC 2022 for all 178 pages plus front and back covers. Other programs used were Adobe Lightroom, Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator, Photo Mechanic, and Google Drive. Computers used were a combination of 2019 Macbook Pro, 2020 Macbook Pro, and three different 2020 iMacs, running Mac OS Big Sur (v11.6).
