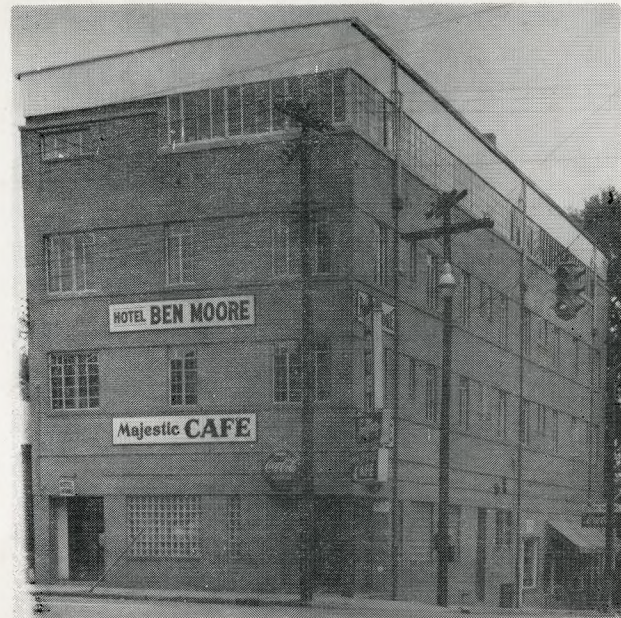

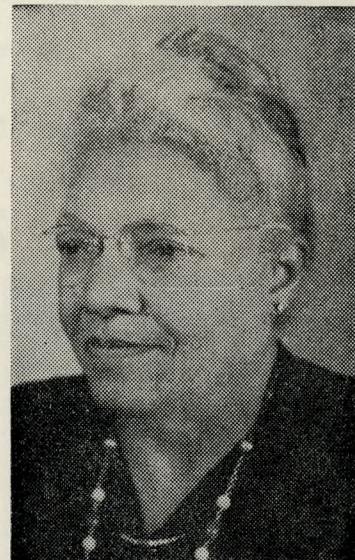

General Information

All delegates who attend the State Association of Women's Clubs at Montgomery on May 31, June 1, 2, 3, 1953 will be the guests of the Montgomery Association of Women's Clubs, Mrs. Zenobia M. Johnson, president. It is expected that all delegates will plan to be in attendance at the opening session at 3:30 on Sunday afternoon, May 31 and remain through the Wednesday business and final session.

Financial obligations that make bona fide clubs are listed herewith:

- (1) State Dues—Ten cents per member enrolled in club.
- (2) National Dues—Fifty cents per member enrolled in club.
- (3) Registration—One dollar for each delegate.
- (4) KNOW YOUR STATE ASSOCIATION—Whatever amount was raised at the rally.
- (5) Scholarship—The highest special contribution for education over ten dollars will entitle the contributing club to the HENRIETTA M. GIBBS Scholarship Trophy.
- (6) Donation—An undesignated sum used for operation of the State Association.
- (7) Organization—The state organizer reporting the organization of the largest number of clubs during the year is entitled to the M. NELLIE BROWN Trophy for the year.

Our Theme For 1953

Our Association of Women's Clubs could be a vital and powerful force in our state and in our nation. It is within the power of the club women of the country to develop and direct public thinking and action for any worthwhile cause. If the individual club woman realized this fact, if we could arouse our women to full cognizance of their power, there would be no question as to the realization of the ideals in this great land of ours.

If it is true that the foundation of any race is predicated upon the character of its womanhood, then the Negro club woman must become increasingly aware of the responsibility that is hers; she must have a keen sense of awareness and a sympathetic understanding of the many problems that challenge us here in America. Not only must she have the awareness and the sympathetic understanding, she must be willing to share her time and efforts to meet the demands by participating actively in all community activities. Hence, we have invited representatives from several of the agencies and movements in our communities which are designed to improve the total living of all of the people of our great commonwealth. We are asking that our club women become informed as to the programs of these agencies and movements, to the end that we all may be more useful citizens living fuller lives and more and more able to meet the challenges that confront us today.

Legislation has been passed which prohibits any member from full participation who is not a registered voter. If the group, representing the majority in our state population has recognized the power of the ballot and the responsibility incumbent upon its constituency to utilize the same, it seems to suggest that our own women, representing the largest minority in our state population, must surely recognize the need and lend every effort toward attaining the desired goal "Every Alabama Club Woman a Registered Voter." Thus "ALABAMA CLUB WOMEN MEET THE CHALLENGES OF TODAY."
